1. Hampshire Children's Trust and development of Local Children's Partnerships

The implications of this for the Gosport Partnership are less profound than may be in some districts, This is because of the development of strong relationships between partners, the existing web of partnership arrangements and the strong common sense of identity. The challenges ahead are to ensure the LCP is focused on the key priorities and establishes the right links with the Hampshire Children's Trust, the Gosport Strategic Partnership and other LSP and County thematic groups.

2. Re-structuring of the Children and Young People's Locality Partnership and stakeholder consultations

The 4 strategy sub groups of the emerging Local Children’s Partnerships have met twice since September in order to identify needs and plan for collective partnership focus areas. These meetings have been well attended and drawn from a wide variety of partners. Each has identified some key objectives, linked to the Hampshire Children and Young People’s Plan. For each of these objectives there are developing delivery plans that need to be completed by July 2010. The Strategic Management Board met on the 24th February and was well attended by local representatives of the Hampshire Children’s Trust Board and other key local partners. A Local Children’s Partnership Stakeholder meeting is planned for Wednesday 23rd March (9.30-2.00) at Bridgemary Community Sports College.

- Although objective H is more universal it was felt to underpin the whole action plan and so should be a priority. The final plan should cross-reference to the concept of the ‘Learning Journey’
